#### 1 ProMoS als Dienst (AllwaysUp)

ProMoS NT wird standardmässig nicht als Dienst ausgeführt (Stand Ende 2019). Dies ist einerseits historisch gewachsen und andererseits ist es während dem Engineering einfacher, wenn auf alle Daten über die integrierten Benutzeroberflächen zugegriffen werden kann (würde heute sicher nicht mehr so umgesetzt).

Es wird empfohlen, alle ProMoS-Installationen komplett fertig zu stellen, bevor die Programme als Dienste gestartet werden (viel einfachere Fehlersuche). Wenn das System fehlerfrei läuft, können die einzelnen Leitsysteme auf den VM's mittels AllwaysUp als Dienste gestartet werden.
